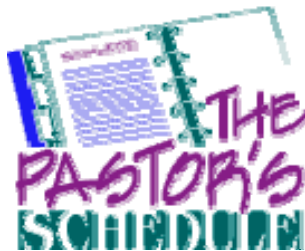

God's Power For Positive Thinking

One thought. One Word. It all begins with a single thought.

"For as he thinks in his heart, so is he." Proverbs 23:7 (NASB)

Thoughts are seeds planted in the mind from external influences and inner conversations. The healthier the seeds, the more productive the garden. The weaker the seeds, the leaner the harvest.

"You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in You, whose thoughts are fixed on You." Isaiah 26:3 (NLT)

One single thought, like one drop of water that sends ripples through a lake, can affect many lives in a good or in a negative way. One thought can build a nation or tear it down. A seed of hope. A seed of doubt. Which one will you choose to sow?

"Be careful what you think, because your thoughts run your life."

Proverbs 4:23 (ICB)

Your thoughts determine your attitude. Your attitude controls your life. Your attitude is your choice. It won't change your circumstances, but it will change how you deal with those circumstances.

"Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus."

Philippians 2:5 (KJV)

The way to change our attitudes is to change our thoughts and the inner conversations we have with ourselves. Stay focused on good things. Push away negative thoughts by displacing them with positive ones.

Youth and Family Ministry

Greetings!

This is the last full day of school for my daughter and I am getting ready to switch to my summer office hours. As I sit here writing this we are a week away from the annual youth shore trip which seems to me to be the official start of Summer regardless of what the calendar claims. This is my second summer at Zion, and I am looking forward to taking the next couple of months as a planning time for my ministry.

As difficult as it is to believe I am coming up on year 2 of my ministry at Zion, and I really cannot believe how quickly the time has passed. In a lot of ways I still feel incredibly new to this position and know that I still have a lot to learn. I thank you for your patience with me as I continue to grow in my role as Youth and Family Ministry director. This congregation is amazing in its support of the staff at Zion and I feel incredibly lucky to be employed here.

Speaking of the Shore trip....This year's theme is Different is Good. I wrote about this theme in a previous Herald article; but would like to expand on it to give you an idea of what the youth and adults will be doing for the week. What we are hoping to accomplish with this year's theme is to help the youth recognize and celebrate the differences inherent in each of us, it sounds a little cliché but so often I don't think we look at the world in terms of differences between people. The youth will look at these differences through the lens of popular culture, as well as getting a biblical perspective on differences by looking at creation and Jesus. The youth will have an opportunity to learn their personal "love language" and explore the different ways that others give and receive love based on Gary Chapman's book *The Five Love Languages of Teenagers*". They will explore how to live with opposites, differences in world cultures, and will even learn and perform an African dance. It's much more than a week at the beach. This year we have 23 youth and 9 adults traveling to the shore from Zion.

As a final thought for this month I want to ask you to be thinking about the youth and family ministry here at Zion. I am looking for suggestions and comments on what we can do better, what works and what doesn't. I need you to be candid with me about the direction we should take the ministry. Thank you in advance for your attention to this matter.

3. Pastor Combs' Report: Attendance for month of May is skewed. The count for the 9:30 service from May 15 is not included. Motion made to accept recommendation and seconded. Motion approved. The following people requested removal from roll: Karen Lee and daughters, Jennifer & Amanda. Motion made and seconded. Motion approved. Report accepted as submitted.
4. Pastor Jorgensen's Report: Report accepted as submitted.
5. Treasurer's Report: Motion made and seconded. Approved as submitted.
6. Investment Treasurer's Report: Report accepted as submitted.
7. Teams, Task Forces and Other Reports:
 - Christian Education – Motion made to accept resignation of Judith Anderson as Nursery Attendant effective June 20th. Motion seconded. Motion approved. Motion made to accept hiring of Mary Koontz as Nursery Attendant effective June 21st contingent upon background checks. Motion seconded. Motion approved.
 - Preschool – Motion made to accept Nicole Firth as part-time teacher of the morning Grasshopper 1 class (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday) for the 2010-2011 school year. Motion seconded. Motion approved.
 - Property – Still waiting for official letter from Fire Chief about issues in the sanctuary that need to be rectified in order to be in compliance with fire codes.
 - Property - Council requested that a contractor come in and do the cleaning and buffing of a test spot on the floor before we can commit funds to have the floor cleaned and buffed.

Children's ministry has several opportunities to serve

What position?	What's involved?	How much time do I have to commit to?
Preschool Sunday School Music Leader (1)	Teach songs to the children for 15 minutes from 9:30 – 9:45 a.m twice a month and lead children in singing to congregation	15 – 20 minutes each Sunday that you lead the children.
Sunday School Teachers (2) Grades 3 & 4	Teach a Sunday school lesson during 9:30 service to the children which includes story, games and/or craft	1 hour teaching time twice a month on rotation from September through early June. Prep time for session – approx. 1 hour depending on lesson for the week.
Jr./Sr. High School Teacher (1)	Teach a Sunday school lesson during 9:30 service to the Jr./Sr. High students through discussions, service projects, games, etc. This is a relational class and need someone who relates to teenagers (they're great kids!)	1 hour teaching time twice a month on rotation from September through early June. Prep time for session – approx. 1 hour depending on lesson for the week.
Substitute Teachers	Being willing to fill in for a teacher if needed from time to time	Approximately 1-2 hours prior to teaching date and 1 hour teaching
Saturday Children's Church Teacher (at 5:30 service)	Teach a 15 minute lesson during the sermon once or twice a month. May include craft/ game with story	15 minutes of teaching time twice a month on rotation from September through early June. Prep time for session – approx 30 minutes depending on lesson for the week.

All of the above positions require a love for the children, a commitment to be a team teacher throughout the school year, & be a church member *Background checks are required on all teachers*

“Quilt Stories” – Women’s Ministry Mini-Retreat

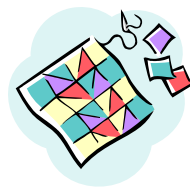
